### EPISTLE READING

St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 2:14-22 BRETHREN, Christ is our peace, who has made us both one, and has broken down the dividing wall of hostility, by abolishing in his flesh the law of commandments and ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby bringing the hostility to an end. And he came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; for through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built into it for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.

## The Gospel of Luke 12:16-21

The Lord said this parable: "The land of a rich man brought forth plentifully; and he thought to himself, 'What shall I do, for I have nowhere to store my crops?' And he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns, and build larger ones; and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I will say to my soul, 'Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; take your ease, eat, drink, be merry.' But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul is required of you; and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God." As he said these things, he cried out: "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

## **Give Thanks at Liturgy**

Thanksgiving Day in America annually falls on the final Thursday of November. Thanksgiving Day in the Orthodox Church falls on every day that the Divine Liturgy is celebrated. That this is so is attested to by one of the names of the Liturgy; namely, the Service of Eucharist. Eucharist comes from the Greek word "eucharistia" which translated is "thanksgiving."

Giving thanks to God on Thanksgiving Day and on days of the Liturgy it is not an option. It is a prerogative mandated by God Himself. This mandate finds expression in Paul's Epistle to the Thessalonian Christians. In 1 Thessalonians 5:18, Paul says "In everything give thanks, for this is the will of Christ Jesus in you." Though a prerogative, I have discovered that one of the things many Orthodox Christians (not all) fail to do at Divine Liturgy is to give thanks. It's sad enough when some choose to whisper, talk, laugh and greet people while they are coming up to receive the Sacrament of Communion, also called the Sacrament of Eucharist. But it is doubly sad when many of these same people and others return to their pews, or worse yet, leave the church early to go to home or to coffee hour, without giving thanks to God.

In a life-long attempt to preclude such sadness from enveloping my own life at Liturgy, I was taught many years ago by parents, Sunday School teachers and priests on the importance of prayerfully giving thanks after Communion. What were the lessons I was taught? They were simple ones! I share them with you.

- 1. Stay in church after Communion has been offered.
- 2. Read the prayers of Thanksgiving that are found in the red Liturgical books that are in the pews.
- 3. Continue to pray, sing and worship God until Liturgy is dismissed.
- 4. Read Luke 17:11-19

"Now it happened as He went to Jerusalem that He passed through the midst of Samaria and Galilee. Then as He entered a certain village, there met Him ten men who were lepers, who stood afar off. And they lifted up their voices and said, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" So when He saw them, He said to them, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And so it was

that as they went, they were cleansed. And one of them, when he saw that he was healed, returned, and with a loud voice glorified God, and fell down on his face at His feet, giving Him thanks. And he was a Samaritan. So Jesus answered and said, "Were there not ten cleansed? But where are the nine? Were there not any found who returned to give glory to God except this foreigner?" And He said to him, "Arise, go your way. Your faith has made you well." (Luke 17:11-19)

At Liturgy, let us not be like unto the nine who are cleansed but fail to give thanks. Instead, let us be like the foreigner who returned to give glory to God and thanksgiving, knowing that by so doing we are acting in a way God would have us act. By do doing we will render honor, glory and worship to our Heavenly Father, together with His beloved Son and the All-Holy Spirit, not only on Thanksgiving Day, but on every day the Divine Liturgy is celebrated.


